As ever, we're looking forward to showcasing the

careers of jockeys and former jockeys at the annual Richard Davis Awards. In a change from recent years, the 2023 Awards will now take place at Warwick Racecourse on Tuesday 7th November.

The winners will be presented with their trophies as part of a special day dedicated to the Awards featuring films about the winners and a running of the JETS Richard Davis Awards Handicap Chase. Invited guests including our generous sponsors, Friends of JETS and other industry stakeholders, will hear from the winners in a special discussion panel which will look at all the different ways in which jockeys are developing their careers both in and out of the saddle.

The Jockey Club Achievement Award

**** THE JOCKEY CLUB

The top Award designed for those jockeys who have significantly achieved in pursuing their new chosen careers and is worth £3,000 to the winner with two runners-up prizes of £500 each.

The IJF **Progress Award**



Worth £2,000, this Award rewards the early progress of those jockeys who have more recently started out on a new career/training path (in previous two years).

BHA **Development Award**



With a prize of £1,000, this award is exclusively for currently licensed jockeys who have worked hard over the last year to develop themselves both in and out of the saddle in order to be as successful as possible as a jockey but also in their career beyond riding.

GEORGE BAKER APPOINTED NEW HEAD OF COACHING

In July we were pleased to announce that former Flat Jockey and Regional Jockey Coach, George Baker has been selected as the Jockey Coaching Programme's new Head of Coaching.

George rode as a Flat jockey for 18 years, achieving Classic success in the 2016 St Leger aboard Harbour Law. He suffered a severe career ending brain injury in a fall in February 2017 and subsequently trained to become a qualified Jockey Coach in October 2020 whilst also sitting on the Board of the Injured Jockeys Fund.

Since then, he has built up a wealth of coaching experience and took on an employed role within the Jockey Coaching Programme in March 2021 as one of five Regional Jockey Coaches, covering the Lambourn and surrounding regional area. He currently coaches 20 Apprentice & Conditional jockeys and oversees many more at his regular weekly drop in coaching sessions at Oaksey House and recently passed a practical assessment to become a qualified Level 3 Coach.
