NEW PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT GRANT FOR YOUNG JOCKEYS

Inspired by a similar scheme run by the English Institute of Sport, we are pleased to be introducing a new grant scheme in 2023 exclusively for young licensed jockeys with less than 50 rides. The aim is to encourage jockeys to engage with JETS and embrace training and development from the very outset of their careers.

The importance of maintaining an 'identity' beyond sport has long been recognised in professional sport and through this scheme jockeys can apply for small grants of up to £250 with funding considered across a range of different areas including trade courses, language or driving lessons, education tutoring, coaching qualifications or industry short courses.

We believe that this grant scheme will help promote positive mental health, the Dual Career concept and allows jockeys to develop their own personal identity away from racing.
